Elk. Mountains. Archery.

Life has a funny way of surprising you. Though I discovered archery hunting later in life, I haven't wasted a moment honing my skills. Fueled by the encouragement of a close friend in Idaho, I secured an over-the-counter archery elk tag for the 2024 season in her neck of the woods.

September 2024 whisked my husband Dave and me away on a 13-day Idaho adventure we'll never forget. After a few days of learning the lay of the land with our friends, we embarked on a five-day solo exploration. Success rates for western archery elk hunts hover around 10%, but our spirits remained high.

Midweek, fortune seemed to smile upon us. We located two impressive bulls. A lone 5x5 kept us on our toes for two thrilling nights, responding eagerly to calls and tree racking. The second night, he materialized within 115 yards, quenching his thirst at a watering hole. Convinced this was my moment, I readied myself behind a sagebrush. Dave coaxed him with a cow call, and the bull bugled before trotting our way. Anticipation surged as I drew back, certain he'd offer a clear shot. But with a sudden turn, he veered downwind, catching my scent. Dejection followed the adrenaline rush, the taste of victory replaced by a bittersweet pang – I had been so close.

The second encounter involved a majestic 7x7 herd bull leading a harem of ten cows. His age granted him the wisdom of staying silent and hidden amongst the trees. He outsmarted us on several occasions. Ultimately, I opted against a risky shot with low recovery chances, allowing him to continue his reign.

Hunting is more than just bagging a trophy. It's about acknowledging your place within the natural order, a primal dance with creatures that face predation daily. These experiences offer profound lessons classrooms could never replicate. Though my freezer remains empty, immense pride fills me. We experienced the very essence of what many hunters chase - an unforgettable adventure deep in the mountains.



DIRECTIONS: From Grand Rapids Michigan take US131 south to the Dorr exit which is 142nd Avenue and go west 6 ½ miles to 26th Street and go south 3 miles to the club grounds.

DIRECTIONS: From Kalamazoo Michigan take US131 north to the Dorr exit which is 142nd Avenue and go west 6 ½ miles to 26th Street and go south 3 miles to the club grounds.

DIRECTIONS: From St. Joe/Benton Harbor, Michigan area take I94 to I 196 towards Grand Rapids, Michigan to M-89 exit. (Exit 34 toward Fennville), turn right on M-89/124th Avenue and continue to follow M-89. Turn left onto M-40, turn right onto 128th Avenue. Turn left onto 30th Street, turn right onto 134th Avenue, turn left onto 26th Street. The club is on the left.
